PASTOR'S CORNER

Change. We've been exploring the realities of changes, both those we seek and those that find us, for the season of Lent. The long, cold winter is finally, also, changing to spring and with it comes the change from Lent, a season of *preparation*, to Easter, a season of *celebration* - of new life, new opportunities, and renewed energy for mission as a people called and claimed by God, through Jesus Christ, to be "Resurrection People" to our world.

We have been navigating change as a congregation for several years as well. Our church has been thinking, praying, discussing and acting on several initiatives and this note will serve as a quick update on their progress:

Wildfire: Elim has been a part of a collaborative relationship with several churches in our conference including Valley of Peace, Faith Lilac Way, St. James, First of Crystal, House of Hope, Holy Nativity and Cross of Glory for five or six years. The pastors meet weekly for Bible study and fellowship, our men's groups have a rotating quarterly meal with a speaker, our confirmands meet once a month together, and our high school ministries are working to build in a once-a-month activity as well.

This past fall we invited the Minneapolis Area Synod to guide us in deepening those relationships by hosting a "first date" with the elected leadership of our councils. This conversation sparked interest in a "second date" that will be happening this spring.

North Side Strategy: Given our unique location between North Minneapolis and the Northwest suburbs, we have also been invited into a strategic conversation with several congregations to our east: Christ English, Salem, St. Olaf, Gethsemane, River of Life and Redeemer. Joy Skjogstad, who served as our consultant a few years ago, is facilitating the strategy on behalf of the Minneapolis Area Synod. At this

point our church council has been asked to approve of our participation in the conversations and to provide two lay leaders to represent the church. There is more information on the North Side strategy in this newsletter on page 9..



Church Innovations: Besides participating in outside conversations, it is important for Elim, as a church community, to continue to discover our own identity in the changing landscape of Robbinsdale and the wider Twin Cities area. We are blessed to have Church Innovations as a tenant on our fifth floor. In lieu of rent, CI has come alongside us in a consulting/facilitator role in our Fall Board/Council leadership retreat and in a smaller Council retreat in March. The image or metaphor that has found particular energy with us is the picture of The Oasis in Exodus, from which Elim gets its name. What does it mean for us to have this location and this mission to provide sustaining spiritual bread to people who are often "traveling through"? How can we sustain our facility and thrive in a world where many people may stop for a moment in their lives only to move on when life's changes beckon? We are seeking new ways to be resilient while providing stewardship of our facility, staff and your gifts in new ways of "being the church" to our world.

In all of these changes I am ever grateful for your generosity, your prayers, and your participation in what continues to be a promising future for Elim and our community.

Elim Music Ministry CD Fundraiser

We are excited to announce Elim's first ever professional CD album to be released this spring! On Saturday, May 17, the Elim Choir, the Ringtones Adult Bell Choir and the Youth Choir will be working with one of the best church music producers in Minnesota in a recording session to produce a fun compilation album to share with our community. The CD sales of this project will be a fundraiser for much-needed repairs to our beloved organ. As the organ approaches the end of its useful life, we will begin needing to make upgrades to each of the cases and ranks that range between \$5,000-10,000 apiece. We would like to be in a position to start making these repairs to this most vital instrument in our sanctuary.

This album will be a retail-quality product with professional artwork, superb audio and all song copyrights covered. Each of the choirs will record some of our favorite songs throughout the years and the end product will be outstanding. We are hoping to gain support from every congregational member to reach out to friends and family to help raise funds for this wonderful endeavor. The success of this fundraiser will pave the way for future album projects in making this a fun tradition for our church and a strong building block within the music ministry.

A: The CD sales will operate under a pre-order basis only starting on Sunday, April 13. We will have a CD sales table set up before and after each church service running through Sunday, May 18 to reserve your CD copy in advance.

Q: How much is each CD?

A: \$20 per CD. We will accept cash or checks payable to "Elim Lutheran Church". Each member of the music ministry will also be equipped with their own CD pre-order forms to take your reservation as well. *Buy 3 CDs, get 1 FREE. Buy 6 CDs, get 2 FREE.

Q: When will I get my CD?

A: The CDs will be completed and distributed at church on Sunday, June 8.



A new way of working together on the North Side

I am excited to have been selected by the Synod to facilitate the North Side Area Strategy Team. This is a new effort on the North Side to inspire new cooperation between the seven ELCA churches here. In my visits to each of the seven churches, I have been amazed by the many assets within each congregation—your commitment to the community, ministry expertise, strategic locations, financial assets, strong lay leadership, facilities, know-how and passion. Our key question in this process is: What could happen on the North Side if we found creative ways to put some of those assets together?

What are we doing?: Coming together to build relationships with each other and dream together about how we could best minister on the North Side. In this process, we will:

- Learn about each other—meet people from other congregations and learn about the work of other North Side churches
- Identify the assets within each of our congregations—what makes your church strong and amazing?
- Learn about the community—what are the pressing issues and concerns on the North Side?

- Look at some other models for ministry—go see some models on the North Side (and perhaps elsewhere in the Twin Cities)
- Make a plan together
- Celebrate our work

What is the outcome?: There are no specific pre-determined outcomes to this process. But we do have a large general outcome to work together on—develop a plan for significant new ways that North Side ELCA congregations can work together.

What's happening now?: Each congregation has been asked to formally approve participation in the process (through your Council) and select three lay representatives to attend Area Strategy meetings. We have scheduled five meetings between now and the end of May for these lay leaders and pastors to meet.

What's the timeline?: Our goal is to develop a plan for our work together by early June—an ambitious timeline! The plan will include significant new ways that North Side ELCA churches can work together. The implementation of the plan will start after that point.


